ABOUT DAWN

The Development Action for Women Network (DAWN) is a non-government, non-profit organization established to assist distressed women migrants from Japan, as well as their Japanese-Filipino children, in the promotion and protection of their rights and welfare. It was registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) on February 6, 1996. In 2011, DAWN expanded its programs to include Filipino migrant domestic workers and their families. DAWN is licensed and accredited by the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) and accredited by the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE).

DAWN is a member of regional organizations such as the Coordination of Action Research on AIDS and Mobility in Asia (CARAM Asia) in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia and the Coalition Against Trafficking in Women Asia-Pacific (CATW-AP). It is also a member of Philippine Migrants Rights Watch (PMRW), the Overseas Land-based Tripartite Consultative Council (OLTCC) and the Regional Interagency Committee Against Trafficking-Violence Against Women (RIACAT-VAW). DAWN's Executive Director is a member of the Global Advisory Council of the VITAL VOICES Global Partnership.

DAWN is an NGO in Special Consultative status with the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations since April 2015 and Special Consultation Relationship with the ASEAN Intergovernmental Commission on Human Rights (AICHR) since March 2018..

Teatro Akebono



DAWN utilizes theater arts in its advocacy program. It combines music, songs, dances and spoken dialogue to convey to the audience the story of migrant women and their children. It provides the DAWN members an activity that help them hone and further develop their creative skills. The workshops also serve as venue where they can express their thoughts, feelings and stories as they deal with their issues.

Through music, songs, dances and act-outs, the children are able to articulate themselves which in effect become therapeutic for them. The participants develop camaraderie and friendship with each other. They gain their self-confidence and self-worth. Thus, they become advocates of their own issues. Teatro Akebono has performed in various prefectures in Japan since 1998. The children are able to visit the country of their fathers and experience Japanese culture. Some children are fortunate to meet their fathers during the Japan tours.
